Wheel Chock & Strap Kit

Mounting Instructions for Wheel Chocks:

- Position ATV on trailer bed in the exact location required
- Place wheel chocks front and back of the rear tires
- Mark Locations
- Secure chocks to trailer bed with proper nuts and bolts (not supplied). Make sure the bolts are 1" longer than the thickness of the trailer bed and chocks.
- Be sure to use flat and spring washers; self locking nuts are also required.

Installing the straps:

- Depending on the size of the tire choose front or back E-slots
- Position straps on the center of the tire
- Squeeze e-fitting latch, and lock in E-fitting to desired slots in wheel chock.

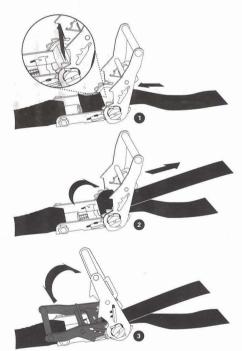
HAUL SAFELY! REMEMBER 3 - TO - 1

ASSEMBLY

AS DETAILED IN ILLUSTRATION:

- 1. FEED WEBBING THROUGH CENTRE SLOT.
- PASS WEBBING THROUGH RATCHET HANDLE. TO ENSURE THAT YOU DO NOT JAM THE RATCHET, PULL EXCESS SLACK.
- 3. ATTACH HOOKS TO STABLE ANCHOR POINTS. OPEN & CLOSE RATCHET HANDLE TO
- *SQUEEZE SPRING RELEASE BAR TO OPEN 180° TO REMOVE WEBBING.





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
